#### YR OF AGARICUS

We enclose herewith the long-promised field data sheets for those collecting *Agaricus* species during this season. For those not familiar with this Project, we have engaged to collect specimens and data on the occurrence and distribution of the genus in our collecting area. We initially proposed to devote 1965 to this project, but will continue it a second year if the information developed shows promise of value. The field note form is designed to fit with a plastic overlay key to species, an experimental procedure to provide a quick diagnosis of species. If this turns out to be workable, we may extend the procedure to other genera. All specimens of interest will be dried and deposited in a herbarium for further study. All collections (which is a set of several specimens in various stages of maturity, in good condition) should be wrapped in wax paper and refrigerated until delivered to Dr. Stuntz's lab, 4th floor, Johnson Hall, University of Washington. Fill out data sheet fully, to the best of your judgment, and include with collection.
